

THE CONSTITUTION OF JAMAICA

A PROCLAMATION



PATRICK L. ALLEN, Governor-General. By His Excellency, the Most Honourable Sir PATRICK LINTON ALLEN, Member of the Order of the Nation, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Order of Distinction, Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, Governor-General of Jamaica.

WHEREAS by virtue of section 20(1) of the Constitution of Jamaica, the Governor-General may make a Proclamation declaring that a state of public emergency exists:

AND WHEREAS section 20(2) of the Constitution of Jamaica provides that a Proclamation made under section 20 shall not be effective for the purposes of subsection (1) unless it is declared that the Governor-General is satisfied, *inter alia* that action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any person or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be likely to endanger the public safety or to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of supplies or services essential to life:

AND WHEREAS section 20(3) of the Constitution of Jamaica specifies that a Proclamation made by the Governor-General for the purposes of and in accordance with that section shall, unless previously revoked, remain in force for fourteen days or for such longer period, not exceeding three months, as both Houses of Parliament may determine by a resolution supported by a two-thirds majority of all the members of each House:

AND WHEREAS I am satisfied that action has been taken or is immediately threatened by persons or bodies of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be likely to endanger the public safety of the community specified in the Schedule:

AND WHEREAS I am satisfied that a state of public emergency exists in the community specified in the Schedule as a result of the aforementioned circumstances:

Now, Therefore, I, Patrick Linton Allen, Member of the Order of the Nation, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Order of Distinction, Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, Governor-General of Jamaica, in exercise of the power conferred upon me by section 20 of the Constitution of Jamaica, and of every other power hereunto enabling, DO HEREBY DECLARE that—

- (a) a state of public emergency exists in the community specified in the Schedule; and
- (b) this Proclamation shall, unless previously revoked, remain in force for fourteen days or for such longer period, not exceeding three months, as both Houses of Parliament may determine by a resolution supported by a two-thirds majority of all the members of each House.

SCHEDULE

Community in which a State of Public Emergency exists

In the following areas in the parish of St. Catherine, that is to say:

- Northern—Parish boundary starting from (18°11'23.3"N, 77°12'59.6"N) which is the intersection of St Ann, Clarendon and St Catherine parish boundary line, imaginary line running east towards Griefield Road, to North South Highway (Moneague Leg), to Guys Hill Square to Seath Field and to (18°14'59.8"N, 76°57'09.8"N)
- Eastern— Parish boundary running south to Sligoville to an imaginary line running from Sligoville intersecting Highway 2000, to Lakes Pen Road, to Port Henderson Road, to Salt Pond Road, to an imaginary point in the vicinity of Hillrun Main Road (76°57'29.746"W 17°55'31.533"N)
- Southern—Imaginary point in the vicinity of Hartland Main Road (77°2'8.698"W 17°55'33.392^T'N) and Hillrun Main Road (76°57'29.746^MW17°55'31.533"N)
- Western— Parish boundary running south to Ginger Ridge to an imaginary line running from Ginger Ridge, to Blue Hole, to Marlie Hill, to Dover Road, to the intersection of the PJ Patterson Highway, then to an imaginary point parallel to Hartland Main Road. (77°2'8.698"W 17°55'33.392"N).

Given under my hand and the Broad Seal of Jamaica at King's House this 18th day of March in the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand and Eighteen and the Sixty-sixth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
