

THE CONSTITUTION OF JAMAICA

A PROCLAMATION



By His Excellency, the Most Honourable Sir PATRICK LINTON ALLEN, Member of the Order of the Nation, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Order of Distinction, Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, Governor-General of Jamaica.

WHEREAS by virtue of section 20(1) of the Constitution of Jamaica, the Governor-General may make a Proclamation declaring that a state of public emergency exists:

AND WHEREAS section 20(2) of the Constitution of Jamaica provides that a Proclamation made under section 20 shall not be effective for the purposes of subsection (1) unless it is declared that the Governor-General is satisfied, *inter alia* that action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any person or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be likely to endanger the public safety or to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of supplies or services essential to life:

AND WHEREAS section 20(3) of the Constitution of Jamaica specifies that a Proclamation made by the Governor-General for the purposes of and in accordance with that section shall, unless previously revoked, remain in force for fourteen days or for such longer period, not exceeding three months, as both Houses of Parliament may determine by a resolution supported by a two-thirds majority of all the members of each House:

AND WHEREAS I am satisfied that action has been taken or is immediately threatened by persons or bodies of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be likely to endanger the public safety of the community specified in the Schedule:

AND WHEREAS I am satisfied that a state of public emergency exists in the community specified in the Schedule as a result of the aforementioned circumstances:

Now, Therefore, I, Patrick Linton Allen, Member of the Order of the Nation, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Order of Distinction, Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, Governor-General of Jamaica, in exercise of the power conferred upon me by section 20 of the Constitution of Jamaica, and of every other power hereunto enabling, DO HEREBY DECLARE that—

- (a) a state of public emergency exists in the community specified in the Schedule; and
- (b) this Proclamation shall, unless previously revoked, remain in force for fourteen days or for such longer period, not exceeding three months, as both Houses of Parliament may determine by a resolution supported by a two-thirds majority of all the members of each House.

SCHEDULE

Community in which a State of Public Emergency Exists

The following area in the parishes of Kingston and St. Andrew-

WEST: The western boundary extends from the coastline by Petrojam Oil Refineries in a

north-easterly direction onto East Avenue, then onto Maxfield Avenue to the

intersection of Rousseau Road.

NORTH: The northern boundary extends along Rousseau Road in an easterly direction

from the intersection of Maxfield Avenue and Rousseau Road to its intersection with Lyndhurst Road and Retirement Road. The boundary then extends south-easterly along Lyndhurst Road to its intersection with Slipe Road, then southerly along Slipe Road to the intersection at Torrington Road. The boundary continues easterly along Torrington Road to Heroes Circle and continues along the northern part to its intersection with Marescaux Road. The boundary then extends north along Marescaux Road then easterly onto Connolly Avenue, then onto Dames

Drive to the intersection with South Camp Road.

EAST: The eastern boundary extends in a southerly direction along South Camp Road

then onto Port Royal Street to the coast.

SOUTH: The southern boundary extends westerly along the coast of Kingston and then

along the St Andrew coastline to the starting point at Petrojam Oil Refineries.

Given under my hand and the Broad Seal of Jamaica at King's House this 14th day of June in the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand and Twenty and the Sixty-ninth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
