THE EMERGENCY POWERS ACT

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2019

DETENTION (KEMAR HENRY O/C RUSTY)
(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF CLARENDON AND ST. CATHERINE) ORDER, 2019

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33(1) and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Detention (Kemar Henry o/c Rusty) (State of Public Emergency for the Parishes of Clarendon and St. Catherine) Order, 2019.
- 2. Kemar Henry o/c Rusty is to be detained from May 12, 2020 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamations, Rules and Regulations of 2019.

- 3. For the purposes of paragraph 11 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
 - (a) Kemar Henry o/c Rusty, has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - (i) Suspected of being a member of a criminal organization, the Bushwacka gang, operating in the Lakes Pen area of St. Catherine and of being involved in gang related robberies and murders to include:
 - (a) The murder of a female known as Nally T in the Lakes Pen community in or around 2013; and
 - (b) The murder of a male known as Theo in the Lakes Pen community in or around April, 2020;
 - (ii) Suspected of being in possession of illegal guns in the Lakes Pen area of St. Catherine; and
 - (iii) Suspected of supplying illegal guns to members of criminal organisations.
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
- 4. In accordance with paragraph 12 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal—St. Catherine and Clarendon, at Suites 3 and 4, 24 Cargill Avenue, Kingston 10 or via email to mhenlin@henlin.pro.
 - (c) After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

DETENTION (RICHARD HENRY O/C PAPA)
(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF CLARENDON AND ST. CATHERINE) ORDER, 2019

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33(1) and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Detention Richard Henry o/c Papa (State of Public Emergency for the Parishes of Clarendon and St. Catherine) Order, 2019.
- 2. Richard Henry o/c Papa, is to be detained from May 12, 2020 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamations, Rules and Regulations of 2019.
 - 3. For the purposes of paragraph 11 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
 - (a) Richard Henry o/c Papa, has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - (i) Suspected of being the leader of a criminal organization, the Bushwacka gang, operating in the Lakes Pen area of St. Catherine and of being involved in gang related murders to include:
 - (a) The murder of a female known as Nally T in the Lakes Pen community in or around 2013;
 - (b) The murder of Andre Green otherwise called Brownman in or around 2018 or 2019; and
 - (c) The murder of a male known as Theo in the Lakes Pen community in or around April, 2020;
 - (ii) Suspected of being in possession of illegal guns in the Lakes Pen area of St. Catherine; and
 - (iii) Suspected of supplying illegal guns to members of criminal organisations.
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

- 4. In accordance with paragraph 12 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal—St. Catherine and Clarendon, at Suites 3 and 4, 24 Cargill Avenue, Kingston 10 or via email to mhenlin@henlin.pro.
 - (c) After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
