THE EMERGENCY POWERS ACT

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2019

DETENTION (MARVINZO TRACEY O/C BRAD/KENO)
(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF ST. JAMES,
HANOVER AND WESTMORELAND) ORDER, 2020

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33(1) and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Detention (Marvinzo Tracey o/c Brad/Keno) (State of Public Emergency for the parishes of St. James, Hanover and Westmoreland) Order, 2020.
- 2. Marvinzo Tracey o/c Brad/ Keno, is to be detained from April 17, 2020 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamation, Rules and Regulations on the 7th day of May, 2019

- 3. For the purposes of paragraph 11 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
 - (a) Marvinzo Tracey o/c Brad/ Keno, is suspected to be concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - (i) Illegal Possession of Firearm and Murder of Antuan Andrew McKenzie which occurred on February 2, 2020 at Baulk District, Burnt Savannah, in the parish of Westmoreland;
 - (ii) Participating Illicit lottery scamming and extortion; and
 - (iii) Being a member of a criminal organization.
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
- 4. In accordance with paragraph 12 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal at the Wexford Hotel at 39 Gloucester Avenue, Montego Bay or via email to westerntrib@2019@gmail.com.
 - (c) After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2019

DETENTION (LEON PULCHAN O/C FRASS MAN)
(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF ST. JAMES,
HANOVER AND WESTMORELAND) ORDER, 2020

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33(1) and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Detention (Leon Pulchan o/c Frass Man) (State of Public Emergency for the parishes of St. James, Hanover and Westmoreland) Order, 2020.
- 2. Leon Pulchan o/c Frass Man, is to be detained from April 17, 2020 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamation, Rules and Regulations on the 7th day of May, 2019
 - 3. For the purposes of paragraph 11 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
 - (a) Leon Pulchan o/c Frass Man, is suspected to be concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - (i) Illegal Possession of Firearms in the Heartford District, in the parish of Westmoreland;
 - (ii) Being a member of a criminal organization and participating in extortion activities.
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
- 4. In accordance with paragraph 12 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal at the Wexford Hotel at 39 Gloucester Avenue, Montego Bay or via email to westerntrib@2019@gmail.com.

(c) After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
