THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2019

DETENTION (AKIME BECKFORD)
(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF
ST. JAMES, HANOVER AND WESTMORELAND) ORDER, 2019

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33 and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Detention (Akime Beckford) (State of Public Emergency for the parishes of St. James, Hanover and Westmoreland) Order, 2019.
- 2. Akime Beckford is to be detained from August 12, 2019 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamation, Rules and Regulations on the 30th day of April, 2019.

- 3. For the purposes of paragraph 13 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:—
 - (a) Akime Beckford has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically;
 - i. Charged in 2018 for offences of wounding with intent, committed against Mr. Christopher Wright as well as illegal possession of firearm;
 - ii. Suspected of being involved in the murder of Kehian Pryce committed on March 21, 2019;
 - iii. Suspected of being involved in a shooting incident at "Mi Yard" restaurant and bar in West End Negril; and
 - iv. Suspected of being a member of a criminal organization; the "Fifty Strong" gang and of being involved in shootings related to gang activities.
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(9) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
- 4. In accordance with paragraph 14 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:—
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal at The Wexford Hotel at 39 Gloucester Avenue, Montego Bay or via email to eprtsecretariat@gmail.com.
 - After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

DETENTION (ROMARIO FERGUSON)
(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF ST. JAMES, HANOVER AND WESTMORELAND) ORDER, 2019

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33 and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Detention (Romario Ferguson) (State of Public Emergency for the Parishes of St. James, Hanover and Westmoreland) Order, 2019.
- 2. Romario Ferguson is to be detained from August 12, 2019 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamation, Rules and Regulations on the 30th day of April, 2019.
- 3. For the purposes of paragraph 13 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:—
 - (a) Romario Ferguson has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically;
 - i. Charged for offences of wounding with intent, shooting with intent, illegal possession of firearm and illegal possession of ammunition;
 - ii. Suspected of being involved in the murder of Kehian Pryce committed on March 21, 2019;
 - iii. Suspected of being involved in a shooting incident at "Mi Yard" Restaurant and Bar in West End Negril; and
 - iv. Suspected of being a member of a criminal organization; the "Fifty Strong" gang and of being involved in shootings related to gang activities.
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(9) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
- 4. In accordance with paragraph 14 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:—
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.

(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF
ST. JAMES, HANOVER AND WESTMORELAND) ORDER, 2019

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33 and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Detention (Courtney Hall) (State of Public Emergency for the parishes of St. James, Hanover and Westmoreland) Order, 2019.
- 2. Courtney Hall is to be detained from August 12, 2019 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamation, Rules and Regulations on the 30th day of April, 2019.
- 3. For the purposes of paragraph 13 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:—
 - (a) Courtney Hall has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically;
 - Suspected of being in a violent feud with fellow "Delete Squad" gang member which has resulted in shootings and killings including the shooting of Vivian Godfrey on March 12, 2018;

- ii. Suspected of being involved in lottery scamming; and
- iii. Suspected of being a member of a criminal organization.
- (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(9) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
- 4. In accordance with paragraph 14 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:—
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
