THE EMERGENCY POWERS ACT

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2020

DETENTION (DEVONTE MILLER O/C SHYON)
(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF KINGSTON
AND ST. ANDREW) ORDER, 2020

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33(1) and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Detention (Devonte Miller o/c Shyon) (State of Public Emergency for the parishes of Kingston and St. Andrew) Order, 2020.
2. (Devonte Miller o/c Shyon) is to be detained from August 3, 2020 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamation, Rules and Regulations on the 26th of January, 2020.

3. For the purposes of paragraph 11 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
- (a) (Devonte Miller o/c Shyon), has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically he is suspected of the following:
 - (i) suspected of being a former member of a criminal organization-the Hypolite Road Gang-operating in the Rockfort area in Kingston 2, and of forming a new criminal organization in the Cheriton Road area of Rockfort;
 - (ii) suspected of being in possession of illegal firearms in the Rockfort area;
 - (iii) suspected of being in a feud with members of the Hypolite Road Gang over the murder of his aunt, Ms. Natasha Dobbs, and of vowing to avenge the murder of his aunt;
 - (iv) suspected of threatening Corporal Leroy Thompson on July 10, 2020;
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(9) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2020 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
4. In accordance with of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
- (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal at the Ministry of National Security, Fourth (4th) Floor, NCB Towers, North Tower, 2 Oxford Road, Kingston 5, St. Andrew or via email to eastkingstonERT@gmail.com.
 - (c) After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISH OF KINGSTON) ORDER, 2020**

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33(1) and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2020, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Detention (Ian Wright o/c Sacramento o/c Sacramento) (State of Public Emergency for the parish of Kingston) Order, 2020.
2. (Ian Wright o/c Sacramento o/c Sacramento), is to be detained from August 3, 2020 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamation, Rules and Regulations on the 14th of June, 2020.
3. For the purposes of paragraph 11 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
 - (a) (Ian Wright o/c Sacramento o/c Sacramento), has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically he is suspected of the following:
 - (i) being a member of a criminal organization namely the “Tela-Viv Gang” operating out of the Kingston Central Police Division and being involved in extortion;
 - (ii) suspected of being in possession of illegal firearms;
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2020 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
4. In accordance with regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal at the Ministry of National Security or via email to eprt.centralandwesternkgn@gmail.com.
