THE EMERGENCY POWERS ACT

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2019

DETENTION (EVERTON DOUGLAS O/C FUBA)
(STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF KINGSTON AND ST. ANDREW) ORDER, 2020

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33(1) and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Detention Everton Douglas o/c Fuba (State of Public Emergency for the parishes of Kingston and St. Andrew) Order, 2020.
- 2. Everton Douglas o/c Fuba, is to be detained from February 12, 2020 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamations, Rules and Regulations on the 26th day of January, 2020.

- 3. For the purposes of paragraph 11 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
 - (a) Everton Douglas o/c Fuba, has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - (i) Being a suspected leader of a criminal organization known as the Jaques Road Gang which operates in the Mountain View area in the Kingston Eastern Division;
 - (ii) Suspected of being involved in criminal activities of the Jaques Road Gang to include the following;
 - (a) The murder of a male known as "Jerry" on or about February, 2018 in the Mountain View area;
 - (b) The murder of Courtney Lyle otherwise called "Charlie" on or about October, 2018 in the Mountain View area.
 - (c) Extortion
 - (iii) Suspected of being involved in a gang rival with Michael Ewan (otherwise called "Mickey One Two", the alleged leader of the Goodwich Lane gang, which resulted in several shootings and killings including:
 - (a) Shooting on December 11, 2017, in Vineyard Town at Michael Ewan, Lloyd Taylor and Marlon Smith;
 - (b) Causing Grievous Bodily Harm to Lloyd Taylor, as a result of the shooting on December 11, 2017, in Vineyard Town;
 - (c) Murder of Marlon Smith as a result of the shooting in Vineyard Town on December 11, 2017;
 - (d) Murder of Bobby Perry (otherwise called "Buju"), who was aligned to the Goodwich Lane gang on or about October 3, 2019, along Goodwich Lane; and
 - (e) Murder of Nichalos Mullings, a resident of Jacques Road, on or about October 11, 2019 at the Norman Gardens Primary School.
 - (iv) Alleged use of abusive language to Mr. Matton Tomlinson of the Peace Management Initiative on January 5, 2020.
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

- 4. In accordance with paragraph 12 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal at the Ministry of National Security, Fourth (4th) Floor, NCB Towers, North Towers, 2 Oxford Road, Kingston 5, St. Andrew or via email to eastkingstonERT@gmail com.
 - (c) After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
