THE EMERGENCY POWERS ACT

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2019

DETENTION JAVORN WHTTINGHAM O/C DRAGON (STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF ST. JAMES, HANOVER AND WESTMORELAND, ORDER, 2020

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33 (1) and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Detention Javorn Whittingham o/c Dragon (State of Public Emergency for the Parishes of St. James, Hanover and Westmoreland) Order, 2019.
- 2. Jayorn Whittingham o/c Dragon, is to be detained from February 5, 2020 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamation, Rules and Regulations on the 7th day of May, 2019.

- 3. For the purposes of paragraph 11 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows—
 - (a) Javorn Whittingham o/c Dragon, is suspected to be concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - Murder of Gabriel Hibbert which occurred on or about August 2, 2017 at Barclay Close, Savanna-la-Mar, in the parish of Westmoreland.
 - ii. Participating Illicit lottery scamming for which he was arrested and charged on or about April 23, 2019 and for which he later absconded. At the time of his arrest he was found in possession of a cellular phone containing identity information.
 - iii. Shooting and Wounding with Intent of Mr. Everton Silent on or about October 12, 2019 at Seaton Crescent, Savanna-La-Mar in the parish of Westmoreland, for which the charges of Wounding with Intent and Illegal Possession of Firearm arising out of the same facts are currently before the Court;
 - iv. Being a leader and participating in a criminal organization/faction of the Dalling Street Gang; and
 - v. Illegal Possession of Firearms in the Dalling Street Community
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
- 4. In accordance with paragraph 12 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - b. A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal at the Wexford Hotel at 39 Gloucester Avenue, Montego Bay or via email to westerntrib@2019@gmail.com.
 - c. After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 2019

AMENDED DETENTION (RUSHANE BRYAN) (STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISHES OF ST. JAMES, HANOVER AND WESTMORELAND), ORDER, 2020

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33 (1) and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Amended Detention Rushane Bryan (State of Public Emergency for the Parishes of St. James, Hanover and Westmoreland) Order, 2019 and refers to the previous Detention Order dated January 16, 2020.
- 2. Rushane Bryan, is to be detained from January 16, 2020 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamation, Rules and Regulations on the 7th day of May, 2019.
 - 3. For the purposes of paragraph 11 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows
 - a. Rushane Bryan, has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - Alleged involvement in illicit lottery scam, wherein on or about October 9, 2018 Mr. Bryan was found in possession of identity information.
 - ii. Alleged involvement in illicit lottery scam, wherein on or about September 2, 2019 Mr. Bryan was found in possession of identity information and admitted to his involvement in a letter scam during a Question and Answer interview on September 14, 2019.
 - iii. Alleged Murder of Calvin Forrest on or about August 25, 2019;
 - iv. Alleged Illegal possession of firearm and ammunition relating to the murder of Calvin Forrest on or about August 25, 2019.
 - b. Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 2019 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
 - 4. In accordance with paragraph 12 of regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - a The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
