THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS (No. 2), 2018

THE EMERGENCY POWERS DETENTION (NEIL CAMPBELL) (STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISH OF ST. CATHERINE)
ORDER, 2018

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by regulations 33 and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations (No. 2), 2018, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers Detention (Neil Campbell) (State of Public Emergency for the Parish of St. Catherine) Order, 2018.
- 2. Neil Campbell is to be detained from September 3, 2018 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamations, Rules and Regulations on the 18th day of March, 2018.

- 3. For the purposes of paragraph 10 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
 - (a) Neil Campbell has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - (i) Charged for Housebreaking on November 23, 2010;
 - (ii) Charged and convicted for illegal possession of firearm; and
 - (iii) Believed to be an active participant in gang activity such as murders, shootings, robberies, extortion etc.;
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by the Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations (No. 2), 2018 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
- 4. In accordance with paragraph 10 of Regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.im.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal via email to nsceptribunal@gmail.com.
 - (c) After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS DETENTION (GLENDON AMOS) (STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY FOR THE PARISH OF ST. CATHERINE) ORDER, 2018

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by Regulations 33 and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations (No. 2), 2018, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers Detention (Glendon Amos) (State of Public Emergency for the Parish of St. Catherine) Order, 2018.

- 2. Glendon Amos is to be detained from September 3, 2018 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamations, Rules and Regulations on the 18th day of March, 2018.
 - 3. For the purposes of paragraph 10 of regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
 - (a) Glendon Amos has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - Believed to be involved in the murder of David Howard who was killed during a robbery at Lemon Ridge, Bambury District, Linstead, St. Catherine on July 10, 2018;
 - (ii) Believed to be involved in several other murders, shootings and robberies in Commodore, Banbury and other communities in the Linstead sub-division area;
 - (iii) Charged with illegal possession of firearm on or about October 6, 2006; and
 - (iv) Believed to be an active participant in gang activity.
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations (No. 2), 2018 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.
 - 4. In accordance with paragraph 10 of Regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
 - (b) A completed Notice of Objection Form may be submitted to the Secretariat of the Emergency Powers Review Tribunal at via email to nsceptribunal@gmail.com.
 - (c) After the completed Notice of Objection Form has been submitted, you or your representative will be contacted and invited to a hearing where you may present your case to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by Regulations 33 and 38 of the Emergency Powers Regulations No. 2, 2018, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers Detention (Dwight Sangster) (State of Public Emergency for the Parish of St. Catherine) Order, 2018.
- 2. Dwight Sangster is to be detained from September 3, 2018 until the end of the period of the public emergency which commenced with the Proclamation of the Governor-General published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement Proclamations, Rules and Regulations on the 18th day of March, 2018.
 - 3. For the purposes of paragraph 10 of Regulation 38, notice is hereby given as follows:
 - (a) Dwight Sangster has been concerned in acts prejudicial to public safety and public order, more specifically:
 - (i) Charged for burglary and larceny on December 21, 2015;
 - (ii) Charged for house breaking and larceny on December 28, 2015;
 - (iii) Charged for house breaking and larceny again on December 28, 2015;
 - (iv) Charged for creating public mischief for falsely reporting a robbery;
 - Suspected of leveling threats of serious bodily harm to his child's mother;
 - (vi) Charged with house breaking and larceny and receiving stolen property on April 21, 2016;
 - (vii) Found in possession of stolen property; and
 - (viii) Involved in gang activity.
 - (b) Section 13(10) of the Constitution of Jamaica gives you the right to request a review of your case at any time during the period of your detention which is to be reviewed by The Emergency Powers Tribunal and Regulation 38(6) of the Emergency Powers Regulations (No. 2), 2018 gives you the right to make objection against the Detention Order to The Emergency Powers Review Tribunal.

- 4. In accordance with paragraph 10 of Regulation 38, please be advised of the following:
 - (a) The Notice of Objection Form may be accessed from the commanding officer at your place of detention or online at mns.gov.jm.
