**THE GENERAL CONSUMPTION TAX (AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULES)
ORDER, 2022, RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS by virtue of section 60 of the General Consumption Tax Act (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), the Minister may amend the Schedules, subject to affirmative resolution of the House of Representatives:

AND WHEREAS on the 13th day of June, 2022, the Minister made the General Consumption Tax (Amendment of Schedules) Order, 2022:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the General Consumption Tax (Amendment of Schedules) Order, 2022, be affirmed:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Honourable House as follows:—

1. This Resolution may be cited as the General Consumption Tax (Amendment of Schedules) Order, 2022, Resolution.

2. The General Consumption Tax (Amendment of Schedules) Order, 2022, which was laid on the Table of the House of Representatives on the 21st day of June, 2022, is hereby affirmed.

THE GENERAL CONSUMPTION TAX ACT

THE GENERAL CONSUMPTION TAX (AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULES) ORDER, 2022

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by section 60 of the General Consumption Tax Act, and of every other power hereunto enabling, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the General Consumption Tax (Amendment of Schedules) Order, 2022, and shall be read and construed as one with the General Consumption Tax Act (hereinafter referred to as the “principal Act”) and all other amendments thereto.

2. The principal Act is amended in Part 1C of the Third Schedule by inserting next after item 31 the following item—

“32. Lithium-ion batteries imported for use in
solar application

June 13, 2022.”
