PART A
ACCOUNTING

QUESTION 1

NN Techie Limited (the company) is an engineering company run by two brothers, Norman and

Nigel Bartok. The company was established by their father, Nick Bartok. He is now retired and

has handed the operations of the company to his two sons, who are also engineers.

A review of the operations reveals that no formal accounting process is in place, and business

transactions are recorded in hard-cover notebooks by two junior clerks with little accounting

experience.

The brothers are of the view that the company needs an injection of cash and have requested a

loan of \$600,000 from First Bank Limited. Consequently, First Bank requested a business plan,

which was submitted by the brothers. The bank has reviewed the business plan and advised that

the loan has been provisionally approved. However, the loan will only be disbursed on the

submission of financial statements for the first three months of the year, and a budget for the

three-month period, January to March 2025, to ascertain if the company will be able to service

the loan.

The brothers consulted you and confirm that the company has financial data but no proper

financial statements.

They would appreciate an explanation of how the business activities, during the period January

to March 2025, and set out below, should be reflected in accordance with the broad groupings

of the elements of financial statements.

(1) Deposited \$700,000 to the company's bank account, as additional capital. This sum

was part of the brothers' inheritance from their grandmother.

(2) Purchased office equipment for \$20,000 and paid by cheque.

(3) Paid \$100,000 to the landlord for office space rental. Payment was made from the

company's bank account.

- (4) Paid salaries to the administrative staff amounting to \$60,000. The payment was made from the company's bank via electronic transfer to all staff accounts.
- (5) Received professional fee income amounting to \$200,000 in cash and subscription fee income of \$20,000. The cash was received by the cashier, who used \$5,000 to purchase personal items for the daughter of one of the brothers.
- (6) Paid for stationery in cash in the amount of \$30,000.
- (7) Borrowed \$120,000 from a small finance house to pay licence fees due and payable March 31, 2025.

Norman has expressed a desire to have a better understanding of the financial performance of the company. He thinks that the undernoted table format (as illustrated) would be useful in identifying the accounts affected, the classification for each and the impact on the two main financial statements.

Required:

- (a) Provide a brief explanation of the following common elements of financial statements:
 - (i) Assets
 - (ii) Liabilities
 - (iii) Owners' equity
 - (iv) Revenue

(v) Expenses

(b) Prepare the table for Norman using the business transactions listed at (1)-(7) above.

(c) Prepare an abbreviated Statement of Profit or Loss using the transactions noted at (1)-(7) above for the three-month period to March 31, 2025.

QUESTION 2

NN Techie Limited (the company) asked you to prepare a cash budget for the first quarter of the year - January, February and March 2025 based on the following information.

Receipts

- (1) Professional fee income \$900,000 in January, \$600,000 in February and \$800,000 in March.
- (2) Commission sales on engineering material \$300,000 for January, \$180,000 for February and \$420,000 for March. Commission income is receivable one month following the month of sale.
- (3) Rental income from letting excess office space in the amount of \$150,000 for each of the months of January, February and March; due on the 1st of each month.
- (4) Additional capital contribution \$370,000 in January, \$280,000 in February.
- (5) Dividend income of \$25,000 from a previous investment in shares due in March.
- (6) Receipt of 50% loan proceeds from First Bank to be credited to the company's bank account in January.
- (7) Interest income earned on the investment in Stonerock Investment Company will be received on March 31, 2025. (See item (6) below in the payments category.)

Payments

(1) Monthly utilities of \$145,000 payable in the month incurred.

- (2) Salaries for all staff of \$400,000 payable in the month incurred.
- (3) Purchase of motor van in the amount of \$3,000,000; 60% deposit in February, 20% in March and the balance in April.
- (4) Purchase of computers in January for cash amounting to \$650,000.
- (5) Miscellaneous overheads in the amount of \$210,000; included in this amount is \$150,000 for depreciation.
- (6) The company plans to invest \$450,000 with Stonerock Investment Company on January 1, 2025, at an interest rate of 10% per year. The company will receive interest quarterly on its investment. (See item (7) above.)
- (7) Monthly payment of wage-related taxes amounting to \$75,000 payable one month in arrears.
- (8) Cash purchase of engineering books amounting to \$165,000 in February.
- Payment of interest due on \$300,000 (part proceeds of the \$600,000 loan) for the (9) period January to March 2025.

The opening bank balance amounted to \$80,000.

Required:

Prepare a cash budget for the first three months of the year (January, February and March) 2025 and advise the brothers whether the company will have sufficient cash to pay the loan interest.

QUESTION 3

Michael Johnson is a newly admitted attorney-at-law and he has just set up his legal practice, MJ Legal Solutions. Fresh from graduating at the top of his class from the Norman Manley Law School, Michael is determined to implement sound office management systems and to modernise legal practice in his country, by blending traditional legal services with cutting-edge

technology.

One of the first matters to be addressed is a standard form engagement letter. He is particularly

concerned about the clauses in relation to fees and billing. Fees could be charged on different

bases, depending on the client and the nature of the matter. Likewise, the billing arrangements

may vary from matter to matter. He wants the standard letter to include appropriate options.

Additionally, Michael faces significant challenges in establishing a secure data management

framework. He plans to adopt a cloud-based system to store all electronic client files, including

sensitive personal data, detailed case files, and confidential communications. Michael is

particularly concerned about safeguarding his clients' information against unauthorised access

and potential data breaches.

Michael is also exploring the integration of artificial intelligence (AI) to enhance his practice's

efficiency. Having attended several legal technology conferences, he is intrigued by Al's potential

to expedite legal research, assist with document drafting, and even predict case outcomes by

analysing vast amounts of legal data. Despite these benefits, Michael's peers have raised

concerns about the ethical and practical implications of deploying AI in legal practice. Michael

must, therefore, balance the promise of technological advancement with the imperative to

uphold the highest ethical standards in his practice.
