THE LAW REFORM (ZONES OF SPECIAL OPERATIONS) (SPECIAL SECURITY AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT MEASURES) ACT, 2017

THE LAW REFORM (ZONES OF SPECIAL OPERATIONS) (SPECIAL SECURITY AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT MEASURES) (GREENWICH TOWN ZONE) ORDER, 2020

WHEREAS section 4 of the Law Reform (Zones of Special Operations) (Special Security and Community Development Measures) Act, 2017 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), provides that the Prime Minister in Council may, by order, declare any geographically defined area within a single continuous boundary in Jamaica, as a zone of special operations for a period not exceeding sixty days if there are reasonable grounds to believe that due to rampant criminality, gaing warfare, escalating violence and murder and the threat to the rule of law and public order, it is necessary so to do:

AND WHEREAS section 4(6) of the Act provides that the Prime Minister in Council may only declare an area as a Zone if the Commissioner of Police and Chief of Defence Staff have agreed in writing that the area should be so declared:

AND WHEREAS the Commissioner of Police and Chief of Defence Staff have agreed in writing that the area geographically defined in the Schedule should be declared as a Zone:

NOW THEREFORE, the Prime Minister in Council, having reasonable cause to believe that due to rampant criminality, gang warfare, escalating violence and murder and the threat to the rule of law and public order, it is necessary to declare the area geographically defined in the Schedule as a Zone, hereby declares as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Law Reform (Zones of Special Operations) (Special Security and Community Development Measures) (Greenwich Town Zone) Order, 2020.
- 2. The area having the geographical limits specified in the Schedule is a zor. of special operations for the purposes of the Act.
 - 3. The said zone shall operate for a period of sixty days.

SCHEDULE

(Paragraph 2)

Area of the Zone

West: Beginning at the intersection of Marcus Garvey Drive and Third Avenue, the boundary extends in a north-easterly direction along Third Avenue and then south-easterly along the train line; continuing north-easterly parallel to West Avenue; then north-westerly for approximately 0.15 km (in the vicinity of Boat Island) and then north-easterly for approximately 0.17 km to Spanish Town Road.

North: Continuing south-easterly from the point along Spanish Town Road to the shared parish borders for Kingston and St Andrew in the vicinity of the intersection of Spanish Town Road and Maxfield Avenue.

East: Continuing from the vicinity of the intersection of Spanish Town Road and Maxfield Avenue in a south-westerly direction along the shared parish borders for Kingston and St Andrew to Marcus Garvey Drive.

South: The southern boundary then extends from the intersection of the shared parish borders for Kingston and St. Andrew and Marcus Garvey Drive in a north-westerly direction along Marcus Garvey Drive to the starting point at the intersection with Third Avenue.
