THE CONSTITUTION OF JAMAICA

A PROCLAMATION



Governor-General.

By His Excellency, the Most Honourable Sir PATRICK LINTON ALLEN, Member of the Order of the Nation, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Order of Distinction, Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, Governor-General of Jamaica.

WHEREAS by virtue of section 20(1) of the Constitution of Jamaica, the Governor-General may make a Proclamation declaring that a state of public emergency exists:

AND WHEREAS section 20(2) of the Constitution of Jamaica provides that a Proclamation made under section 20 shall not be effective for the purposes of subsection (1) unless it is declared that the Governor-General is satisfied, *inter alia* that action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any person or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be likely to endanger the public safety or to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of supplies or services essential to life:

AND WHEREAS section 20(3) of the Constitution of Jamaica specifies that a Proclamation made by the Governor-General for the purposes of and in accordance with that section shall, unless previously revoked, remain in force for fourteen days or for such longer period, not exceeding three months, as both Houses of Parliament may determine by a resolution supported by a two-thirds majority of all the members of each House:

AND WHEREAS I am satisfied that action has been taken or is immediately threatened by persons or bodies of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be likely to endanger the public safety of the community specified in the Schedule:

AND WHEREAS I am satisfied that a state of public emergency exists in the community specified in the Schedule as a result of the aforementioned circumstances:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, PATRICK LINTON ALLEN, Member of the Order of the Nation, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Order of Distinction, Knight of Grace of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, Governor-General of Jamaica, in exercise of the power conferred upon me by section 20 of the Constitution of Jamaica, and of every other power hereunto enabling, DO HEREBY DECLARE that—

- (a) a state of public emergency exists in the community specified in the Schedule; and
- (b) this Proclamation shall, unless previously revoked, remain in force for fourteen days or for such longer period, not exceeding three months, as both Houses of Parliament may determine by a resolution supported by a two-thirds majority of all the members of each House.

SCHEDULE

Community in which a State of Public Emergency Exists

In the following areas in the parish of Kingston, that is to say-

North:

Starting at the intersection of Oakland Road and Spanish Town Road, travelling north-easterly along Oakland Road then south-easterly onto Waltham Park Road, north-easterly onto Delamere Avenue then easterly along Delacree Road to the intersection of the said Delacree Road and Maxfield Avenue, southerly along Maxfield Avenue and then easterly onto Rosseau Road, southerly along Lyndhurst Road then onto Studio One Boulevard to the intersection of Studio One Boulevard and Slipe Road.

East

Intersection of Studio One Boulevard and Slipe Road travelling southerly along Slipe Road continuing onto Orange Street, then westerly along Harbour Street onto Pechon Street and Ocean Boulevard travelling southerly to the shoreline in the vicinity of the Crafts Market.

South:

Point at the corner of Ocean Boulevard (south of the Crafts Market) travelling north-westerly along the shoreline to the western end of PETROJAM.

West:

Starting at the western end of PETROJAM then easterly to a point of intersection with Marcus Garvey Drive, north-westerly along Marcus Garvey Drive to the intersection of Marcus Garvey Drive and Fourth Street, continuing north-easterly along Fourth Street onto Third Avenue and then onto Sixth Street, continuing along at a short segment of track east of the Tinson Pen runway onto MOU trail to the intersection with Spanish Town Road, and finally north-westerly along Spanish Town Road to the start point at Oakland Road.

Given under my hand and the Broad Seal of Jamaica at King's House this 23rd day of September in the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand and Eighteen and the Sixty-seventh Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
