PUBLIC BUSINESS

The Hon. Nigel Clarke, MP, Minister of Finance and the Public Service, having obtained the suspension of the Standing Orders, moved:

THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE ROAD TRAFFIC (LICENCE DUTIES) ORDER, 2022, RESOLUTION

WHEREAS section 12(2)(a) of the Road Traffic Act (hereinafter referred to as the Act) provides that the Minister with responsibility for finance may by order revoke, increase, reduce or alter any licence duty specified in the First Schedule:

AND WHEREAS by virtue of section 12(4) of the Act an order made under subsection (2) of the Act shall be subject to affirmative resolution of the House of Representatives:

AND WHEREAS on the 14th day of July, 2022 the Minister made the Road Traffic (Licence Duties) Order, 2022:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the Road Traffic (Licence Duties) Order, 2022, be affirmed:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Honourable House of Representatives as follows:

1. This Resolution may be cited as the Road Traffic (Licence Duties) Order, 2022, Resolution.

2. The Road Traffic (Licence Duties) Order, 2022, which was laid on the table of the House on the 19th day of July is hereby affirmed.

THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE ROAD TRAFFIC (LICENCE DUTIES) ORDER, 2022

In exercise of the power conferred on the Minister by section 12(2)(a) of the Road Traffic Act, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Traffic (Licence Duties) Order, 2022, and shall come into operation on the 14th day of July, 2022.

2. On the coming into operation of this Order, motor vehicles not deriving motive power from an internal combustion engine worked by cyclinder or cylinders, shall be exempt from the payment of licence duties for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

3. A motor vehicle to which paragraph 2 applies shall, at the date of import, be three years old or less.

4. Effective on the date on which this Order comes into operation, a person who has paid licence duties in respect of a motor vehicle to which paragraph 2 applies, shall be entitled to receive a credit of such portion of the amount paid by the person in respect of the remaining period to which the licence duties apply.
